

▶ **Ag Sales > 34.5 acres**

- 24 good sales in 2015 sales study
 - Previous two years 2014 = 15 and 2013 = 36
- Back on the up swing?
- Anticipate slight reduction in value

▶ **State increased Ag Tier for .5% class rate**

- 2013 Pay 2014 = \$1,500,000
- 2014 Pay 2015 = \$1,900,000
- 2015 Pay 2016 = \$2,140,000
- 2016 Pay 2017 = \$2,050,000

▶ **Rural Residential Sales**

Automatic (ACH) Tax Payments

- *Settlement payments To Townships*
 - No takers on this since I mentioned it last year
 - 2/3 receive ACH payments, 1/3 receive check payments
 - Goes directly to the bank account
 - An email message is sent indicating the deposit will be made, how much, and on which day
 - Forms available here to sign up
 - Do not require but considering it – just like all employees have not choice but direct deposit



Automatic (ACH) Tax Payments

- *Payments from 370 Property owners*
- Currently 565 parcels enrolled *(previous years 529,395, 317 and 222)*
 - County will mail you notice at least a week in advance
 - ACH will take out of your account on due date of taxes
 - May 15
 - Oct 15
 - Nov 15




2015 Budget for a Better Minnesota

Governor Dayton's plan would invest \$6 billion over the next ten years to address the state's highway funding deficit, invest \$2.356 billion in local government transportation projects, and provide \$2.92 billion for transit systems across Minnesota. The Governor's proposal would create an estimated 119,000 new jobs, and build the infrastructure necessary to meet the demands of a growing population and an expanding state economy.
