On February 1, 2022, the County Board approved the construction bid for Branches A, B, C, D for Goodhue County Ditch 1 to Ellingson Drainage, Inc. The construction has been completed on all the Branches, and we received the Final Engineers Report for Branch B.

Background:

The County received the Final Engineer's Report on November 16, 2022.

Public Hearing notices for this meeting were advertised in the Zumbrota Record on November 23, 2022, November 30, 2022, and December 7, 2022.

The landowners also were mailed individual notices of this meeting on November 29, 2022.

Recommendation:

Staff and consultants recommend that the County Board:

- 1) Adopt the Findings and Testimony into the record and approve the attached resolution concerning the Improvement to County Ditch 1; and
- 2) Approve an interest rate and schedule options for landowners payment to the Ditch Fund for Repair and Improvement of County Ditch 1.

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to certify final project acceptance and recommend final payment for the Goodhue County Ditch (CD) 1 Tile Repair and Improvement Project near Kenyon, MN. Minnesota Statute 103E.555 details specific requirements for the completion of public drainage system projects: "When a contract is completed, the engineer shall make a report to the drainage authority showing the contract price, the amount paid on certificates, the unpaid balance, and the work that is completed under the contract." The following memorandum is intended to fulfill the requirements of this statute and provide a fiscal summary of the project.

PROJECT UPDATE

Ellingson companies has completed all work within the contract. Construction observation completed by HEI staff and supplemented by Goodhue County staff indicate that all project contract items have been fully completed consistent with the project plans and specifications. The Contractor has provided the proper documentation required for project closeout, including IC-134 forms and lien waivers from subcontractors and suppliers (Attachment C). HEI has prepared a record drawing of the project and provided it to Goodhue County staff.

DAMAGES

An estimate of land area subject to damages within the construction footprint was included in the Final Engineer's Report (FER). Based on the areas provided in the FER, the Viewers Report then estimated a damage cost for each landowner.

Prior to construction, County staff coordinated with landowners regarding the upcoming work limits. Landowners all elected to plant through the anticipated work area, understanding that crop within the work area may be subject to damage. HEI then staked the work area (generally a corridor 100' in width) prior to construction. At the start of construction, Ellingson mowed the entire work limits area, to facilitate traversing through the project corridor and to clearly demarcate the construction limits for staff. This mowing operation was in compliance with the construction specifications. The work that followed to complete the construction contract did not require the use of the entire staked/mowed work limits.

On November 1, 2022, Jon Houglum submitted a claim (via email) of damages of \$3,793 to crops planted on his property (See **Attachment D**). The damages are based on 1.5 acres, at 225 to 245 bushels per acre, at \$6.20 per bushel. Mr. Houglum contends that although the damaged acres were within the work limits, the area damaged was not necessary to be completed for the work.

While we empathize with Mr. Houglum's lost crop, the area damaged was within the work limits identified as likely to be damaged. To obtain the best construction prices, it is important not to confine the contractor to too narrow of a work area or place other undue restrictions on the contractor. This is why the plans indicated a 100' width for the work area, and provided discretion for the contractor to work within that area. The work area is consistent with the damage area identified within the FER and damage payments recommended within the Viewer's Report, and any additional damages paid in this area would be duplicative.

Therefore, we recommend that final damages paid to landowners by the Drainage Authority be consistent with the damages indicated in the Viewers Report, and that no additional damages be paid.

The County Board should consider the recommendations provided herein and any subsequent claims presented prior to or at the project closeout hearing. This memorandum is advisory, and the County Board may choose an alternative damages payment method or amount.





PAYMENT RECOMMENDATION

Ellingson Companies has applied for final payment for work completed on the CD 1 Tile Repair and Improvement Project. We have reviewed the completed quantities submitted by Ellingson Companies. The attached tabulation shows quantities as submitted by Ellingson and the quantities recommended for payment.

COMPLETION OF CONTRACT







FINDINGS & ORDER ACCEPTING CONTRACT

At a duly noticed and public meeting, the Goodhu	e County Board of Commissioners, sitting as	
the Drainage Authority for Goodhue County Ditch	1, held a final hearing on the acceptance of	
completion of contract for the improvement of Goo	odhue County Ditch 1 on December 13, 2022,	
at which hearing Commissioner	moved, seconded by Commissioner	
for adoption of the following Findings and Final Order:		

Findings:

- 1. The Goodhue County Board of Commissioners is the public drainage authority for Goodhue County Ditch 1 under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 103E ("Drainage Authority").
- 2. The Drainage Authority received a petition on February 26, 2021, requesting the improvement of Lateral B of Goodhue County Ditch 1 ("CD 1") pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 103E.215 ("Petition"). A surety bond was filed with the Administrator's Office on that same date.
- 3. After appointing an engineer and viewers, the Drainage Authority adopted Findings and Order on November 16, 2021, ordering the improvement of CD 1.
- 4. Upon the advertisement of the notice of awarding of the contract consistent with Minn. Stat. § 103E.505 and Minnesota law, the Drainage Authority's engineer conducted the meeting to open, review, and accept bids. The bids were reviewed by the project engineer and a contract for construction was awarded to Ellingson Companies for \$171,964.40.
- 5. The Drainage Authority executed three change orders. On July 27, 2022, the Drainage Authority executed Change Order 1 with a net increase of \$559.86. On August 2, 2022, the Drainage Authority executed Change Order 2 with a net increase on \$5,090.07. On November 2, 2022, the Drainage Authority executed Change Order 3 with a net increase of \$550.00.
- 6. Upon substantial completion of construction of the repair, the project engineer inspected the construction and prepared a technical memorandum to the Drainage Authority

showing the contract price, the amount paid on certificates, the unpaid balance, and the work that is completed under the contract, including the temporary damages actually incurred to affected properties. The engineer's Final Acceptance Report dated November 15, 2022, was filed with the Drainage Authority and made available for public inspection.

- 7. The engineer reported a final contract price of \$178,164.33.
- 8. The engineer's opinion excludes any defects in construction not discovered during installation and covered by backfill, latent defects and other matters covered by the contractor's warranty. The engineer's conclusion does not relieve the contractor of any contractual warranty obligations.
- 9. The engineer reported that as of November 15, 2022, the contractor had been paid \$124,547.82, with an unpaid balance of \$65,628.59.
- 10. The engineer recommended a final payment amount of \$65,628.59.
- 11. Upon receipt of the engineer's report, the Board set a time and location for a hearing on the report, gave notice of the hearing by mail to affected landowners at least ten days before the hearing and by posting at the meeting place and county courthouse for three weeks. The notice included an invitation that a party objecting to the acceptance of the contract may appear and be heard.
- 12. On December 13, 2022, the Drainage Authority held a duly noticed and public hearing on the acceptance of the contract.
- 13. At the hearing, the engineer presented his report. The engineer addressed two concerns raised prior to the hearing by affected landowners:
 - a. Jeff Solberg communicated to Drainage Authority staff that the contractor placed erosion control netting on his driveway which interferes with mowing grass. The engineer stated that the netting is biodegradable, which is designed to break down after a period of time, but with the drought, there likely has not been enough moisture to achieve the accelerated breakdown of the netting. With the frozen ground conditions, there is nothing that can be done at the moment, and it likely will have broken down further by next spring, so the engineer recommended that the condition be reviewed next spring with Drainage Authority staff. The engineer further noted that there is a warranty period on the project, and that closing the project out will not prevent this issue from being rectified if the netting does not break down this spring.
 - b. Jon Houglum communicated a claim to the Drainage Authority for crop damages amounting to \$3,793. The claim is based upon 1.5 acres at 225 to 245 bushels per acre at \$6.20 per bushel. Mr. Houglum contends that although the 1.5 acres of

crop were within the work limits of the project plans and specifications, the area damaged was not necessary for the contractor to complete the work. The engineer noted that the area damaged on Mr. Houglum's property was within the work limits identified in the final engineer's report as likely to be damaged and for which temporary construction damages were ordered at the final hearing. The engineer stated that additional damages paid in this area would be duplicative and recommended that final damages paid to landowners by the Drainage Authority be consistent with the damages indicated and approved in the viewers' report, with no additional damages to be paid.

- 14. At the hearing, the Drainage Authority took public comment on the project and completion of the contract and a record of all comments was made by the Drainage Authority. No substantive public comments were given that required additional inquiry into completion of the contract.
- 15. Based on the proceedings and record herein, the Drainage Authority determines that the contract has been completed in accordance with the plans and specifications.

Order:

Based on the foregoing Findings and the entire record of proceedings before the Drainage Authority, the Goodhue County Board of Commissioners, acting as the drainage authority for Goodhue County Ditch 1, hereby orders as follows:

- A. The contract herein is accepted as complete.
- B. Final payment in the amount of \$65,628.59 is directed to be paid to Ellingson Companies.
- C. Claims for damages beyond those awarded in the findings & order establishing the improvement are hereby denied.

Background:

Statute requires all drainage expenses to be paid from the Ditch Fund. As such, we are requesting to add assessments to the parcels benefitting from the repairs and improvements made to County Ditch 1 including Branch B.

Discussion:

Minnesota Statutes 103E.651, Subd 2 instructs "the auditor to keep a separate account for each drainage system. The account must be credited with all money from the sale of bonds and bond premiums and all money received from interest, liens, assessments, and other sources for the drainage system..."

The total proposed assessment is \$605,197. The non-government owned parcel with the highest assessment is \$42,410.02, while the lowest is \$1.15. The average assessment excluding parcels assessed less than \$500 for non-government owned parcels is \$15,434.83.

There will be a need in the future for ongoing assessments for minor repairs such as weed spraying and tree removal. The timeline on when these assessments will need to begin will be evaluated on an ongoing basis. Items that impact the timing include the interest rate and payment term on this assessment, amount of prepayments received on this assessment, and the costs of these minor repairs.


The annual assessment term can go up to but not exceed 20 years. Based on discussions with the Ditch Authority's attorney, projects of this size are typically assessed with annual payments over a 10 year period. The interest rate charged is limited by statute, with a current limit of 4%. Staff ran multiple forecasts with interest rates varying from 2% to 4%. The scenarios with a 10 year assessment period with interest rates set at either 2, 3, or 4% were all viable, however charging a rate less than 3% significantly reduces the flexibility of the Ditch Fund. Charging less than 3% interest will most likely require the County to begin making assessments for minor repairs much earlier as discussed above.

See attached Assessment Summary by parcel number and benefit map for reference.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Board approve the assessment of \$605,197 related to the Ditch Repair and Branch B improvement. Staff also recommends the assessment be paid in ten (10) annual installments with an interest rate of 3% and an interest accrual date of January 1, 2023.

(ASSESSMENT ORDER)

At a duly noticed and public meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Goodhue County, the Board was presented with information regarding drainage system costs and assessments necessary to pay drainage system costs related to Goodhue County Ditch 1 ("CD 1"). The Board had previously given instruction to its staff to take the actions necessary to certify assessments for drainage system costs. Pursuant to the Board's instruction, staff prepared a draft assessment order for the Board's consideration. Based on the information provided, Commissioner moved adoption of the following:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes, section 103E.725 provides, all fees and costs incurred relating to a drainage system, including repairs, inspections, engineering, viewing, and publications, are costs of the drainage system and must be assessed against the property and entities benefited; and

WHEREAS, the Board, pursuant to procedures under the drainage code, Statutes, chapter 103E, has performed work and incurred costs on CD 1; and

WHEREAS, Statutes, section 103E.655, requires the costs for drainage project proceedings and construction to be paid from the drainage system account by drawing on the account and Statutes, section 103E.645 requires the payment of fees and expenses; and

WHEREAS, the drainage system accounts for CD 1 do not contain sufficient funds to pay current costs; and

WHEREAS, Statutes, section 103E.655, provides that if money is not available in the drainage system account to pay current costs, the Board may, by unanimous resolution, transfer funds from its general revenue fund to the drainage system account; if the Board transfers money from another account or fund to a drainage system account, the money plus interest must be reimbursed from the proceeds of the drainage system that received the transfer; and the interest must be computed for the time the money is actually needed at the same rate per year charged on drainage liens and assessments; and

WHEREAS, Statutes, section 103E.755, allows the Board to establish a repair fund, surplus, in the drainage system accounts in order to have funds available for future actions and costs on the drainage systems; and

WHEREAS, assessments to repay drainage system costs may be paid in annual installments not to exceed 20 years at a rate of interest not to exceed the rate determined by the state court administrator for judgments under Statutes, section 549.09 (currently 4% maximum).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Goodhue County Board of Commissioners, sitting as the public drainage authority for CD 1, adopts the following drainage system assessments, installment schedules, interest rates and directs certification thereof to the Goodhue County Auditor/Treasurer for collection:

Goodhue County Ditch 1:

Goodhue County, Minnesota

Total to be assessed:	605,197
Annual Installments:	10
Interest rate on installments:	3%

FURTHERMORE, Drainage Authority staff shall notify affected property owners of their anticipated total assessment and offer the opportunity to pre-pay the assessment to avoid incurring interest on the assessment.

This resolution shall serve as the Board's assessment order as required by Minnesota statutes chapter 103E; and

FURTHERMORE, the Goodhue County Board of Commissioners authorizes & ratifies inter-fund loans from the Goodhue County general fund to the drainage system accounts for CD 1 to cover deficiencies in the accounts in fiscal year 2023.

Seconded by Commissioner	 After discussion, the Board Chairpersor
